(a) whether India's position at international level in the field of food processing is the lowest;

(b) if so, the facts thereof and reasons therefore;

(c) whether the Government are taking any action to bring about policy changes in the field of food processing and thereby improving country's ranking at the international level;

(d) if so, the details thereof;

(e) whether the Government was not able to utilize the amount allocated during the last three years; and

(f) if so, the reasons therefor?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (SHRI SYED SHAHNAWAZ HUSSAIN)

(a) to (d): Department of Food Processing Industries have notreceived any information indicating that India's position in international level in the field of food processing is the lowest. For the development of processed food sector, the steps taken by the Government includes the following :-

(i) Provision of soft loan and grant-in-aid for the development of processed food sector;

(ii) Inclusion of food processing industries in the list of priority sectors for bank lending;

(iii) Exemption of most of the processed food items from the purview of licensing under Industries (Development & Regulation) Act;

(iv) Automatic approval for foreign equity up to 100% for most of the processed food items except alcohol and beer and those reserved for small scale sector subject to certain conditions.

(e) & (f): The plan funds allocated and utilized for the schemes of the Department of Food Processing Industries during the last three years are as follows:
