- (d) if so, the main points discussed;

- (f) if so, the details of demands and the extent to which they have been considered?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN RESPECT OF PARTS (A) TO (F) OF LOK SABMARRED QUESTION NO. 89 FOR ANSWER ON 28/7/2000 REGARDING 'TOBACCO INDUSTRY'.

- a) No change is contemplated in the present practice of not permitting FDI in the tobacco sector.
- b) No, Sir.
- c) Yes, Sir. Discussions were held with representatives of tobacco growers, traders and manufacturers on 2nd June, 2000 and with traders and manufacturers on 30th June 2000.
- d) Main points for discussion included increased buyer's participation in tobacco auctions, increased purchase of tobacco by STC and Minimum Support Price (MSP) operations by Tobacco Board in respect of low grade tobacco.
- (e) &(f) In response to the demand for crop holiday, Tobacco Board has suspended the registration activity for growers and crop size fixation in Andhra Pradesh. State Trading Corporation has also responded to the demand for growers by accelerating its operation for procurement of FCV tobacco from all auction platform. Tobacco Board has also commenced minimum support price operation in respect of low grade tobacco in Andhra Pradesh.
