(a),(b)&(c) No, Sir. No specific agreement has been signed with France to combat international terrorism. Both countries have, however, agreed to cooperate with each other to evolve a global consensus against international terrorism. France supports India's draft for a Comprehensive Convention on International Terrorism. The India-EU Summit Joint Declaration, issued in Lisbon on 28 June 2000, also commits both sides to the further strengthening of cooperation in preventing and combating terrorism.
