- (a) whether the Government are aware of the deficiencies in the implementation of Mid-day meal scheme in various States;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the steps taken to bring about improvements in the implementation of the Mid-day meal scheme? .

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (Dr. SANJAY PASWAN)

(a)&(b): As per available information, States/UTs, namely, Andhra Pradesh, Chhatishgarh, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, A&N Islands, D&N Haveli, Daman & Diu & Pondicherry areproviding meals across the respective States/UTs. Haryana is implementing a meal programme in 6 blocks, Goa in 1 block, Madhya Pradesh across the state except 23 blocks, Mizoram in 546 schools, Orissa inrural areas of Bolangir, Kalahandi, Koraput, Malkangiri, Nawapara, Nawarangpur, Rayagada, Sonepur & Boudhdistricts and in Integrated Tribal Development Authority (ITDA)blocks, Punjab in 17 blocks, Uttaranchal in 26 blocks, West Bengal in 1100 schools and Delhi in MCD Schools.In Chandigarh ready to eat food is being distributed. Other States/UTs are distributing foodgrains under the scheme.

(c) The Government has been constantly urging the States/UTs notproviding cooked meals, to implement the cooked meal programme.
