- (a) Whether it is a fact that the Lok Pal Bill is one of the longest pending Bills in the Parliament;
- (b) If so, the reasons therefor alongwith its present position; and
- (c) the steps taken by the Government for early passage of the Bill?

## Answer

(a) to (c): The Lokpal Bill, 2001 was introduced in the Lok Sabha on 14.8.2001. This Bill was subsequently referred to the Department-related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Home Affairs for examination and report. The Standing Committee presented its report to the Parliament on 31.12.2001. The Standing committee made certain observations/recommendations on this Bill which have been examined in consultation with the Ministry of Law and Justice. Based on the decision taken by the Government on the various observations/recommendations made by the Standing Committee, the Lokpal Bill, 2001, together with the necessary official amendments thereto, is presently pending for consideration and passing in the Lok Sabha.
