UNSTARRED QUESTION NO:1766 ANSWERED ON:14.03.2002 BLAST IN BASANPALLI RAILWAY STATION SAMUDRALA VENUGOPAL CHARY

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether a newly constructed railway station was blasted by Nexalities of the banned People's War Group atBasanpalli in Andhra Pradesh;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the value of railway property damaged in the blast; and
- (d) the preventive measures taken by the Government to stop such incidents in future?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINIST RAILWAYS (SHRI O. RAJAGOPAL)

- a) Yes, Sir.
- b) On the night of 26.12.2001, some activists of PWG blasted one room of a building which was underconstruction for the Railway Station at Basanpalli causing damage to signaling equipment, etc. In this connection, a case has been registered by the local Police/Chinnakothapalli in their station Cr. No. 87/2001u/s 427, 436 & 448 IPC, r/w 3 & 5 of Explosive Substance Act, Section 3 & 4 of Prevention of Damage to Public Property (PDPP) Act and section 8(1) of Andhra Pradesh Public Security Act. The case is under investigation.
- c) Rs. 8 lakhs approximately.
- d) Maintenance of Law and Order is a State Subject and hence the responsibility to prevent such incidents lieswith the State Governments. However, the Railways on their part, have deployed armed pickets at vulnerable stations to supplement the efforts of the State Government.
