Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether poverty ratio in the rural areas has dropped considerably as revealed at the National Conference on Poverty and Human Rights organized by UNESCO in September 2003;
- (b) if so, the decrease recorded in the rural population living below poverty line during the last five years;
- (c) the allocations made to States for providing assistance to the rural population in the matter of food, education, drinking water, sanitation etc. during the period, State-wise; and
- (d) the manner in which the money provided has helped in raising the standard of the BPL families, State-wise?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT(SHRI ANNASAHEB M.K. PATIL)

- (a) & (b): The estimation of population living below the poverty line is undertaken by the Planning Commission on a quinquennial basis since 1973-74. The estimates of incidence of poverty (poverty ratio) in rural areas of the country have shown a declining trend over the years. The estimates of 1993-94 indicated 37.3% of rural population living below poverty line and as per 1999-2000 estimates this percentage has decreased to 27.1%.
- (c) A statement indicating the State-wise Central allocation for all the rural development programmes for the period from 1999-2000 to 2003-2004 is at Annexure-I.
- (d) The money utilized under various programmes of this Ministry has a positive impact on the socio-economic development of the families living below the poverty line which has been established by a number of evaluation studies carried out by different independent Research Institutions. The results of the Concurrent Evaluation of Swarnjayanti Gram Swarozgar Yojana (SGSY) also indicate that more than 37% individual beneficiaries and 15.1% Self Help Groups (SHGs) were able to cross the poverty line. Statewise results of Concurrent Evaluation of SGSY (1st Round) are at Annexure-II.
