STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) AND (b) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 299 REPLY ON 22.12.2003 REGARDING SMUGGLING OF CROCODILES.

- (a) & (b) Vessels from Myanmar, Indonesia, Thailand and other neighbouring countries do visit the Andaman and Nicobar Islands and sometimes manage to take marine products. Occasional cutting of trees is also resorted to by them for meeting their camping requirement and for repairing/construction of boats. The action taken to check such activities includes:
- 1. Regular patrolling by Forest Department of the Union Territory.
- 2. Patrolling by Coast Guards and Indian Navy in deep sea.
- 3. Camps by Police in far flung islands.
- 4. Technical and financial assistance to Andaman and Nicobar administration by the Government of India for protection of wildlife in Protected Areas.
