(a): The targets of track renewal were 2710 kms., and 3250 kms. Respectively for the year 1998-99, 1999-2000 and 2000-2001. Progress achieved during the 3 years was 2967 kms., 3006 kms. And 3250 kms. Respectively.

(b): 12500 kms of track on Broad Gauge, 5000 kms on Meter Gauge and Narrow Gauge was due for renewal as on 1.4.2001.

(c) & (d): The yearly targets for track renewal are fixed after likely availability of funds within the plan size of the Railways is known.

(e) to (g): No, Sir. The pace of renewal is commensurate with the funds available.
