(b) & (c): The Inquiry Commission headed by Shri Justice G.N. Ray, retired Judge of Supreme Court of India, was appointed to inquire into the accident at Gaisal station of Katihar Division of Northeast Frontier Railway has submitted its report on 28.1.2001. As per findings of the Commission the accident occurred due to "Failure of Railway Staff".

Action against the staff & officers, as recommended by the Commission has been initiated as per Discipline and Appeal Rules. The Commission has made a total of 21 recommendation of which 18 have been accepted.
