- (f) The Apparel Export Promotion Council had participated in Buyer-Seller-Meets in Latin American Countries, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa and had participated in International Menswear Cologne Fair, Germany, and Hong Kong Fashion Week, Hong Kong. In addition above, the Council has taken delegation to Latin American Countries for exploring the new avenues. The Council has been organising India International Garment Fair and India Knit Fair for direct marketing and exposure to overseas buyers in respect of garments for Autumn, Winter and Spring Summer sessions separately each year. The Council has established Apparel Training & Design Centres in various locations throughout Country for providing skilled manpower for the Garment Industry.
- (g) The Government has been taking a number of measures such as encouraging exporters to participate in buyer-seller meets, fairs and exhibitions, enabling import of capital goods at concessional duty for export production, special arrangements for duty free import of raw materials for export production; product development and quality Upgradation through appropriate training programmes, providing comprehensive testing facilities through network of laboratories etc. to upgrade readymade garment industry and to accelerate exports. Government has also been taking a number of measures to improve infrastructure facilities for exports including assistance under the Export Promotion Industrial Park (EPIP) and Critical Infrastructure Balancing (CIB) Schemes,
