- (a) One of the items discussed in 36th Session of Indian Labour Conference (ILC) held from 14-15th April, 2000 was industrial sickness. Some members of the ILC were of the opinion that the Board of Industrial Financial Reconstruction in its present form is not effective in handling the problems of industrial sickness.
- (b): No, Sir.
- (c): Does not arise.
- (d): The major recommendations of ILC including setting up of a separate restructuring fund for PSUs, closer participation of workers in industry, setting up of a national revolving fund for labour education and establishment of labour academies by State Governments to provide quality education to the children of workers.
