(d) to (e) Yes, Sir. Under the mandate of the National Common Minimum Programme of the Government, health care is one of the seven thrust areas wherein it is proposed to increase the expenditure in health sector from the current 0.9% of GDP to 2-3% of GDP over the next five years with main focus on Primary Health Care. The Budgetary allocation for health sector has increased by about 30% in 2005-06 over that of 2004-05.
