Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of Minimum Support Price (MSP) awarded to foodgrains in different States during the last three years, State-wise and year-wise; and
- (b) the criterion being followed to determine the MSP of foodgrains in the State?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI KANTI LAL BHURIA)

(a): The Government announces each season Minimum Support Prices (MSPs) of kharif and rabi foodgrains. The MSPs are uniform for the whole country. The MSPs of foodgrains announced since 2003-04 are as follows:

(Rs. Per Quintal)

Crop 2003-04 2004-05 2005-06

Paddy (Common) (Grade A) 550 560 570 Jowar 580 590 600 Bajra 505 515 525 Ragi 505 515 525 Maize 505 525 540 Wheat 630 640 650 Barley 525 540 550

- (b): The Central Government decides on the Minimum Support Prices (MSPs) for various agricultural commodities taking into account the recommendations of Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP), the views of State Governments and concerned Central Ministries as well as such other relevant factors, which in the opinion of the Government, are important for fixation of MSPs. While recommending MSPs, the CACP keeps in view
- (i) the need to provide incentive to the producer for adopting improved technology and for developing a production pattern broadly in the light of national requirements;
- (ii) demand and supply situation;
- (iii) the need to ensure rational utilization of land, water and other production resources;
- (iv) cost of production;
- (v) the likely effect of the price policy on the rest of the economy, particularly on the cost of living, level of wages, industrial cost structure, etc. and
- (vi) terms of trade between agricultural sector and non-agricultural sector.
