- (a) whether National Monitoring Committee for Minority Education has recommended that districts with 10% or above educationally backward minorities may be identified all over the country for establishing schools in order to provide uniformity of standardization and equality;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the committee has suggested for appointment of Urdu teachers in KVS, NVS and other schools in the areas inhabited by 8-9% Urdu speaking people;
- (d) if so, whether the Government propose to open regional centers of the council for promotion of Urdu in Mumbai, Lucknow, Kolkata, Bangalore and Hyerabad;
- (e) if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) the steps taken or being taken by the Government on the recommendations of the NMCME?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINSTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI M.A.A.FATMI)

- (a) & (b) Yes, Sir. The Standing Committee of the National Monitoring Committee has recommended that districts with 10% or above educationally backward minorities may be identified all over the country for establishing Madrasa schools on the lines of Central Schools.
- (c) Yes, Sir.
- (d) & (e) There is a regional centre of the National Council for the Promotion of Urdu Language at Hyderabad. No proposal for establishment of new centres is under consideration at present.
- (f) Before implementation the recommendations require detailed examination in consultation with all concerned.
