- (d) the time by which these pending projects are likely to be cleared?

(a) to (d): Currently, one thousand four hundred T.V. transmitters are functioning in the country including eighty-four in U.P. These provide coverage to urban as well as rural population in their respective coverage zones. Multichannel TV coverage has been provided to the entire country (except A&N Islands) through Doordarshan's free-to-air DTH service "DD Direct Plus". It is possible to receive DTH signals anywhere in the country with the help of a small sized dish receive unit. New transmitters are not, therefore, contemplated now.

Projects are formulated and processed for financial approval from time to time taking into consideration the position of the prevailing Five Year Plan and availability of resources. Presently no transmitter project is pending for financial approval.
