DECLINE IN FAMILY PLANNING PROGRAMMES
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Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether family planning programmes have been declining;
- (b) if so, the reasons therefor;
- (c) the Government formulated schemes for propagation and expansion of the family planning programmes;
- (d) the funds to be provided by the Government for implementation of Family Planning Programmes during the year 2004-05; and
- (e) the number of vasectomy operations conducted under the programmes during each of the last three years?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SMT. PANABAKA LAKSHMI)

(a)&(b): No, Sir. The performance figures for Family Planning Methods as given below indicate that acceptability of contraceptive services has increased in the country.

(c): Compensation in lieu of loss of wages is paid to acceptors of sterilization @ Rs.150/- per sterilization. This has recently been revised to Rs.200/- per Tubectomy and Rs.250/- per Vasectomy in EAG States, to cover the transactional costs and to ensure better quality in these procedures. An enhanced package of compensation is being offered to the accredited Private/NGO Health facilities in these states, for sterilization and IUD insertion through models of social marketing and social franchise. Contraceptives are being provided to clients both through free supply and

social marketing channels. New contraceptives like IUD 380-A and Emergency Contraceptives have been included in the National Family Welfare Programme and client specific publicity of Family Welfare theme is being undertaken through mass media and at decentralized levels.

(d): An amount of Rs.528.67 crores has been directly earmarked for Family Planning Services during the year 2004-05 under the National Family Welfare Programme.
