STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN PARTS (A) AND (B) OF LOK SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 145 FOR ANSWER ON 1.12.2004 REGARDING REFORM OF RECRUITMENT PROCESS.

Recruitment to the Indian Administrative Service, the Indian Foreign Service, the Indian Police Service and other various Central Services are made through the Civil Services Examination. To review the present scheme of the Civil Services Examination, the Union Public Service Commission had appointed the Expert Committee under the chairmanship of Prof. Y. K. Alagh. Recommendations of Prof. Y.K. Alagh Committee alongwith the comments of the U.P.S.C. are under examination.

2. Separately, it has also been proposed that in order to keep pace with the latest development in various fields, both nationally and internationally, and to locate the best available talent, the recruitment should be made at a young age. On this suggestion, Government have sought suggestions from all Chief Secretaries of the State Governments, Cadre Controlling Authorities participating in the Civil Services Examination and LBSNAA, Mussoorie.
