- (a) the details of commodities banned for exports and those on which ban has been lifted during the current year;
- (b) whether the Director General of Foreign Trade has issued a notification banning the export of meat of goats and sheep;
- (c) if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the details of steps taken by the Government to promote exports from the country particularly from Jharkhand?

## **Answer**

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.312 FOR ANSWER ON 20TH MARCH, 2007 REGARDING 'BAN ON EXPORT OF COMMODITIES'

- (a) Pulses, sugar, Bone in Meat of buffalo, Goat and Sheep, Wheat and Milk Powder were the commodities banned for export during 2006-2007. Out of these, the ban has been lifted in respect of Kabuli Chana and meat of goat and sheep.
- (b) & (c) Notification No 30 (RE-2006)/2004-2009 dated 21.8.2006 banning export of bone-in-meat was issued by Director General Foreign Trade. Ban on export of bone-in-meat of goats and sheep has since been lifted vide Notification No 46 (RE-2006)/2004-2009 dated 20th February, 2007
- (d) There are promotional measures like Assistance to States for Infrastructure Development of Exports (ASIDE); Market Access Initiative (MAI); Marketing Development Assistance (MDA) which are applicable to all states. The benefits under these schemes are available to Jharkhand also.
