- (d) if so, the details thereof?

- (a) & (b): No instances of widespread complaints that certain nationalized banks are still reluctant to sanction education loans for prole-sional courses have come to the notice of the government However, on receipt of any specific complaint against a particular bank necessary action is initiated to redress the complaint
- (c) & (d): Yes, Sir. Banks are providing educational loans to students pursuing higher studies in India and abroad. The salient features of the educational loan scheme are at Annex.
