(a) whether during the acceptance trials, the Russian built Krivak-III class frigate, INS Talwar developed snag in the Shtil-1 surface-toair missile weapons system;

(b) if so, whether Naval Commander refused to approve a faulty weapons system in Russia;

(c) if so, whether the delivery of warship was delayed over a year;

(d) if so, whether the Russia has paid the penalty for delays specified in the contract;

(e) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and

(f) the steps taken by the Government in this regard?

Answer

MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI PRANAB MUKHERJEE)

(a) to (c): Yes, Sir.

(d) to (f): The delivery of the first frigate, INS Talwar, was delayed on account of unsatisfactory performance of surface-to-air missile weapon system. It was delivered 13 months after the original delivery date. Negotiations are in progress for assessing the Liquidated Damages as provided in the contract.
