As on 26.2.2007, the Sixth Central Pay Commission had held 8 meetings, which include its hearings of Unions/Associations of Central Government employees. The Terms of Reference of the Sixth Pay Commission include examination of desirability and the need to sanction any interim relief till the time the recommendations of the Commission are made and accepted by the Government.

The Government will take a decision on grant of interim relief to Central Government employees, after a recommendation in this regard is received from the Pay Commission.
