STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PART (a) to (d) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 213 FOR 27.08.2007 REGARDING INSURANCE COVERAGE TO AGRICULTURAL LABOURERS

- (a): Based on the survey conducted by the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) in 2004-05, it has been estimated that the percentage of rural population `Below Poverty Line` was 21.8%, a majority of which would be in the category of agricultural labours. As per Census 2001 (latest available), the number of agricultural workers in India was 10.67 crores. A statement showing the state-wise data of agricultural workers is annexed.
- (b) & (c): The Unorganised Sector Workers Social Security Bill and formulation of social security scheme for unorganized workers are under active consideration and all efforts are being made to introduce the Bill during the current session of Parliament. The modalities of the scheme and coverage thereof are being examined.
- (d): There are various schemes/ programmes being implemented by the Government for the welfare of rural labour, including agricultural labourers. Some of such schemes are: Swarnjayanti Gram Swarojgar Yojana; Sampoorna Grameen Rojgar Yojana; Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana; National Social Assistance Programme; etc. The Government has recently enacted National Rural Employment Guarantee Act which provides 100 days of guaranteed wage employment in every financial year to every household whose adult members volunteer to do unskilled manualwork.
