- (a) whether India, Myanmar and Bangladesh propose to start a gas pipeline project jointly;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the details of the progress made so for in this regard?

Answer

MINISTER OF PETROLEUM & NATURAL GAS & PANCHAYATI RAJ (SHRI MANI SHANKAR AIYAR)

(a) to (c) ONGC Videsh Limited (OVL) and GAlL(India) Limited (GAlL) are partners with Daewoo International, South Korea and Kogas, in A-1 Block in Myanmar. They have struck gas in this block. The gas can be transported from Myanmar to India through onland pipeline or offshore pipeline, subject to the availability of gas in commercial quantities justifying a pipeline project. The most economical option appears to be an on-land pipeline transiting through Bangladesh. However, the Government of Bangladesh has to take a final view in the matter.
