- (a):- No, Sir.
- (b):- Does not arise.
- (c):- While there is no proposal for setting up of University for Aviation Studies, the Government has taken various steps to promote flying training to reduce the gap between demand and supply of skilled Indian pilots. These include upgradation and modernisation of training infrastructure of Indira Gandhi Rashtriya Uran Akademi (IGRUA) to enhance its training capacity from 40 to 100 pilots per year, setting up of a world class flying training institute at Gondia, Maharashtra for training 100 cadets and assistance to flying clubs by allocating trainer aircraft through Directorate General of Civil Aviation/Aero Club of India.
