- (a) the reasons on which all appointments including scientists and engineers are made on contract basis in the Centre for Development of Telematics (C-Dot);
- (b) whether due to contract basis system, the brain-drain is regularly prevailing in this organization;
- (c) if so, the details thereof;
- (d) the number and percentage of expertise leaving this organization during the last three years, as on date; and
- (e) the steps taken/being taken by the Government to prevent the brain-drain from this organization?

Answer

- (a) Sir, C-DOT was set up as an autonomous R & D project organization on 25th August 1984, when all appointments were made on contract basis. This practice has been followed ever since.
- (b) & (c) Sir, even though appointments are made on contract basis, the contracts are normally reviewed and renewed regularly. However some employees leave the organization for personal reasons, including disparity in compensation level at C-DOT vis-Ã -vis private Telecom & IT industry.
- (d) Sir, the details are given below.
