- (a) and (b): The Programme 'Vidya Vahini' was conceived by the Department of Information Technology as a pilot project to make full use of Information and Communications Technology (ICT) and Internet to transform learning environment from mono-dimensional to multi-dimensional. The pilot project has been implemented in 140 Govt./Govt. aided schools in the following 7 districts in 6 States in the country:
- i) Kuppam (Chittoor), Andhra Pradesh
- ii) Gandhi Nagar, Gujarat
- iii) Hazaribagh, Jharkhand
- iv) Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh
- v) Allahabad, Uttar Pradesh
- vi) South 24 Parganas (Kolkata), West Bengal
- vii) Parlivaijnath (Beed), Maharashtra
- 20 Govt./Govt. aided schools were selected in each of the 7 districts. In each district one training lab has also been set up in one of the schools covered in the pilot project, for training the teachers in the use of ICT in education.
