- (a) the percentage of scheduled Tribes living below the poverty line in various States;
- (b) the percentage of Scheduled Tribes benefited by various schemes of the Government during each of the last three years, Statewise:
- (c) whether the number of BPL people have increased in various States during the said period;
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor, State-wise; and
- (e) the steps taken by the Government to bring them at par with the people of other communities

Answer

MINISTER OF TRIBAL AFFAIRS (SHRI P.R. KYNDIAH)

- (a) The Planning Commission estimates the incidence of poverty at National and State level. The latest such survey was conducted in 1999-2000 A statement showing State-wise percentage of Scheduled Tribe population living below the poverty line in 1993-94 and 1999-2000 is at Annexure I.
- (b) The number of Scheduled Tribe families benefited under various schemes of Government under Point 11(b) of 20 Point Programme during the last three years is given in the Statement (Annexure-II).
- (c) & (d) It may be observed from the Statement (Annexure-I) that in most of the States/UTs the number of BPL people have decreased. The BPL population has been increased in the rural areas of Orissa and in the Urban areas of Bihar and Gujarat
- (e): Various schemes under the sectors of Agriculture Animal Husbandry, Forestry, MFP Operations, Minor Irrigation and Cottage and Small Scale Industries are being implemented under the strategies of rural development and Tribal Sub-Plan for raising income level of scheduled Tribes.
