- (a) As per information furnished by Ministry of Culture, criteria adopted to determine the eligibility of languages to be considered for classification as a 'classical language' are as under :-
- (i) High antiquity of its early texts/recorded history over a period of 1500-2000 years.
- (ii) A body of ancient literature/texts, which is considered a valuable heritage by generations of speakers.
- (iii) The literary tradition be original and not borrowed from another speech community.
- (iv) The classical language and literature being distinct from modern, there may also be a discontinuity between the classical language and its later forms or its offshoots.
- (b) In addition to Sanskrit; Tamil, Telugu and Kannada have been notified as classical language.
