- (b) The Hon'ble Prime Minister emphasized the importance of Science and Technology in the development of the country and its emergence as a knowledge superpower in the 21st century. He also said that the major challenges before the country, including climate change, water resource management, food security and disease control, could be effectively faced only by upgrading our scientific capabilities.

The Science Congress was attended by about 7000 delegates from India and abroad including two Nobel laureates from the United States of America. A large number of scientific and technical papers were presented during the Congress. In addition, this year's Children's Science Congress was also organized during the 97th Indian Science Congress which was attended by about 3500 school children from all over India. The Science and Technology Exhibition – Pride of India' - organized on the occasion attracted about 250,000 visitors who were mainly students of different age groups.
