(a) to (c) In pursuance of National Telecom Policy, 1999, the National Frequency Allocation Plan 2000 (NFAP-2000) was evolved after taking into consideration of the requirements of various stakeholders which became a public document. It is reviewed and revised generally in every two years in line with the decisions taken in the World Radiocommunications Conferences (WRCs) of ITU and also the spectrum requirement of various stakeholders in the country. The NFAP-2008 has been evolved which is presently in force. The Review/Revision of National Frequency Allocation Plan(NFAP) is a continuous process.
