Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is making attempts to reverse the disturbing trend of students declining interest in basic science especially in the rural areas;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;
- (c) the details of funds allocated and spent for the purpose in the Eleventh Five Year Plan; and
- (d) the steps being taken to correct the situation in future?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SMT. D PURANDESWARI)

(a) to (d): There is no decline in the interest of students in basic sciences at the Secondary level. Infact the number of students opting for science in Class X has been increasing over the last 3 years. The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has taken various initiatives to promote interest of students in science such as restructuring of syllabus of science; increasing the weightage to practical work; development of supplementary material on activity based learning of science concepts; holding of Regional and National level science exhibition; holding orientation programmes for science teachers etc.

The Central Government had set up a Task Force for Basic Scientific Research in Universities. In order to implement its recommendations, the Task Force was constituted into an Empowered Committee.
