STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (f) OF LOK SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 1686 FOR ANSWER ON 8.3.2010

- A Committee was set up in October 2008 to recommend measures that would bring about:
- (a) Optimal efficiency in the system, with greater focus on Information & Communication Technology (ICT);
- (b) Greater efficiency and economy in supply services through outsourcing and reorganization;
- (c) Greater transparency and accountability in regard to management of defence expenditure;
- (d) Higher efficiency in logistic supply chain management;
- (e) Outcome orientation in defence spending;
- (f) Enhanced self-reliance by tapping the strength of the vibrant private sector;
- (g) High levels of preparedness/serviceability of weapon systems;
- (h) Greater efficiency and economy in training.
- 2. The Committee was headed by Shri V.K. Misra, former Secretary (Defence Finance). The other members of the Committee were retired three-star officers from the three Services and two serving Joint Secretary level officers from the Ministry of Defence and Defence (Finance).
- 3. The Defence Expenditure Review Committee has submitted its report.
- 4. The main recommendations made by the Committee relate to greater use of Information & Communication Technology; Streamlining of Acquisitions and Procurement; Empowering Defence Industrial Base and enhancing private sector participation; and, improvement in logistics and maintenance management, support services, training, infrastructure, financial management and project management.
- 5. Various officers in the Ministry of Defence have been assigned the responsibility of looking into the recommendations of the Committee.
