- (a): The average time to scrutinise one proposal by the Programme Divisions of the Ministry of Rural Development is only a few days, in case the proposal is received complete in all respect as laid down in the respective Programme Guidelines.
- (b) & (c): The State Governments/UT Administrations, District Rural Development Agency (DRDA)/ Zilla Parishads have been advised to enclose all the relevant documents/ information, while sending proposal to the Ministry of Rural Development to minimise average time in processing the proposals.
