- (a) & (b) In order to allow greater participation by the civil society on issues relating to development and social change, Government has formulated a Policy on Community Radio whereby Educational Institutions, 'Non-profit' organizations like civil society and voluntary organizations, State Agricultural Universities, ICAR institutions, Krishi Vigyan Kendras, Registered Societies and autonomous Bodies and Public Trusts registered under Societies Act or any other such act relevant for the purpose, can apply for grant of permission to set up Community radio Stations subject to fulfillment of the conditions laid down in the Policy guidelines. The details are available in this Ministry's website: www.mib.nic.in. This policy enables eligible applicants to expand community broadcasting for promoting elementary education amongst other subjects.
- (c) Does not arise. State Governments are not eligible to apply under Community radio Policy.
