- (a) whether the Government has received any complaint with regard to alleged involvement of taxi drivers in committing crimes especially at the Delhi Airport;
- (b) if so, the total number of such cases reported against the taxi drivers during each of the last three years, crime-wise;
- (c) whether the connivance of Police Personnel in such crimes have been reported;
- (d) if so, the action taken in the matter; and
- (e) the corrective measures proposed to be taken to curb such cases in future?

(a) to (e): Yes, Madam. Delhi Police has received complaints against the taxi drivers in committing crimes. The total number of cases reported to Delhi Police against the taxi drivers during the year 2007, 2008 and 2009 are as follows:

2008 Cheating 02

Abduction/Murder 01

2009 Cheating 01

No complaint regarding involvement of Delhi Police personnel in such cases has been reported. The corrective measures being taken to curb such cases are as follows:-

- 1) Effective surveillance near taxi stands.
- 2) Deployment of police pickets in remote/vulnerable areas for special vehicle checking.
- 3) Random checking of Taxis/Autos.
- 4) Wider publicity through media, so that public can inform about the illegal acts of the taxi drivers.
- 5) The biometric system of identification for taxi operators at the IGI Airport.
