- (b) whether this facility is available at Goa airport also;
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (d) the time by which the AIPS will be made operational at Goa airport?

- (a): Advance Passenger Information System (APIS) in its first phase has become operational at six international airports namely, Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Hyderabad, Banglore and Cochin.

(c)&(d): The second phase of implementation of APIS involves its extension to all the international airports in the countries including Goa. However, since it involves creation of major infrastructural set up, definite timeline cannot be fixed in this regard.
