- (a) & (b): Memorandum of Understanding has been signed in February, 2010 between the Government of India and Government of Nepal regarding development of railway infrastructure at 5 border points along the Indo-Nepal border. The details of these lines with cost involved as per the survey reports is as under:

- 1 Jogbani Biratnagar (Nepal) 18 243
- 2 Jayanagar Bijalpura (Nepal) & its extension to Bardibas 68 447
- 3 Nepalganj Road Nepalganj (Nepal) 12 149
- 4 Nautanwa Bhairahawa (Nepal) 15 176
- 5 New Jalpaiguri Kakarbhita via Panittanki (Nepal) 46 358
- (c) to (e): Out of the above works, Jogbani-Biratnagar new line and Jayanagar to Bijalpura Gauge Conversion & its extension upto Bardibas have been prioritized to be taken up in first phase. Detailed Engineering Survey for Jogbani-Biratnagar has been completed. Detailed engineering survey for Jayanagar-Bardibas has also been taken up. The time frame is yet to be fixed.
