(a) the policy for trade apprenticeship and training of trainees in Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL);

(b) the plants where such training is being imparted including the number of trainees alongwith the basis of selection of those trainees;

(c) whether the said training programme has been discontinued by SAIL;

(d) if so, the reasons therefor; and

(e) the steps being taken by the Government to provide the training to labourers keeping in view the necessity of trained/skilled manpower?

(a) Training to Trade Apprentices is provided as per provision of The Apprentices Act, 1961.

(b) Placewise details of training provided in SAIL Plants during last five years is given below:

Bhilai Steel Plant 87 Durgapur Steel Plant 47 Rourkela Steel Plant 48 (under training at present) Bokaro Steel Plant 392 (253 under training at present) Alloy Steel Plant 125 Salem Steel Plant 152 (22 under training at present)

The basis of selection of Trade Apprentices for training under the provisions of The Apprentices Act, 1961 varies from plant to plant which include, nomination from local employment exchange, written test & interview, sponsorship from Government ITI etc.
