STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (c) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 449 DUE FOR REPLY ON 27TH APRIL, 2010

- (a): 141.93 lakh qtls. certified/quality seeds are available for Kharif 2010 against the requirement of 123.12 lakh qtls. projected by the States. No shortfall has been reported by any State for certified/quality seeds of major crops. Specific regional shortages in Rajasthan and some other States have been tied up through farm saved seeds. No shortage of seeds has been reported in Gujarat.
- (b): The requirement and availablity of seeds for Kharif-2010 is at Annexure.
- (c): The Government of India facilitates availability of certified/quality seeds through National Seeds Corporation (NSC) and State Farms Corporation of India (SFCI) and through several schemes such as Integrated Scheme of Oilseeds, Pulses, Oilpalm and Maize (ISOPOM), National Food Security Mission (NFSM), Development & Strengthening of Infrastructural Facilities for production and distribution of quality seeds, Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY), Mega Seed Project (Indian Council for Agricultural Research).
