Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the instances of poaching of tigers, leopards and elephants by electrocuting them in National Parks have been reported in the last three years;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, year-wise and State-wise; and
- (c) the steps taken by the Government to check this cruel means of execution?

Answer

- (a)&(b) No instances of poaching of tigers by electrocution are reported. Details of the death of elephants due to electrocution during the last three years, state-wise are at Annexure. Details of poaching of leopards due to electrocution are not collated at the Ministry.
- (c) Steps taken by the Government to check death of animals by electrocution includes:
- 1. Extensive patrolling by forest staff in Wildlife Sanctuaries, National Parks and other forest areas.
- 2. Strengthening of communication and wireless network.
- 3. Provision of arms and ammunitions for the protection staff.
- 4. Establishment of protection camps and watch-towers at strategic locations.
- 5. Involvement of local people in protection works by awareness generation programmes.
- 6. Steps are taken by the Government to keep the high-tension wires out of the way of animals.
