STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (e) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 544 FOR 04.05.2010 REGARDING "ENCROACHMENT ON INDIAN TERRITORY".

(a)to (e): No, Madam. There are no reports indicating encroachment on Indian territory on account of fencing by neighbouring countries. However, there are cases of adverse possession along Indo-Bangladesh border. As per available information, some land belonging to a Tea Estate in Karimganj district, Assam, is under the adverse possession of Bangladesh. The resolution of issues relating, inter-alia, to adverse possession is being addressed through bilateral institutional mechanisms, like the Joint Boundary Working Group, between India and Bangladesh.
