- (a) & (b): As per information received from the Department of Financial Services, there were 9,90,188 Motor accident claim cases in respect of all the member companies of General Insurance (Public Sector) Association of India pending as on 31.3.09 in Motor Accident Claims Tribunals including 96,789 cases in Maharashtra state.
- (c) to (e): There is no plan at present to set up more courts and appoint more judges in existing courts for early disposal of such cases.
