- (e) whether the State Government could be alerted against Koshi and other rivers devastating floods on the basis of early warning system; and

- (a) & (b) Department of Space, under the Disaster Management Support (DMS) programme, provides information derived from satellites and aerial survey data, to all States, at near real-time basis. The information provided is mainly on impact of certain disasters, such as, flood, cyclone, earthquake and landslide; assessment of the severity of agricultural drought; and areas affected by forest fires. Such information derived by satellite and aerial data, provided by the Department, is used by concerned States in planning relief, rehabilitation and mitigation of disasters. Further, the department also supports emergency communication during natural disasters through satellite based fixed networks as well as mobile devices.
- (c) Yes Sir,
- (d) The devastating Kosi flood inundation, caused due to a breach in the embankment of the River (outside India),was continuously monitored using data from Indian and foreign satellites. The inundation information was made available to Government of Bihar, at near real-time basis, which helped them in planning the relief measures.
