## MINISTER OF TEXTILES (SHRI DAYANIDHI MARAN)

(a) to (d): A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.188 FOR 16.7.2009.

- (a) & (b): Yes, Madam. Textile sector in India had been adversely affected by technological obsolescence. This was hampering the production as well as quality standards in the sector. Having realized the lacunae, Technology Upgradation Fund Scheme (TUFS) was introduced by Government of India in 1999 to ensure higher production with quality.
- (c) & (d): There have been representations seeking higher subsidy under TUFS. However, Government reckons that the current level of assistance under TUFS is adequate and accordingly, does not contemplate any change in the structure of the scheme at this stage.
