CPF RECRUITMENT IN MAOIST AFFECTED AREAS

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has any proposal for recruitment from Maoist affected areas in the Central Para-military Forces (CPF);
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the time by which such recruitment is likely to be conducted;
- (c) whether the Union Government has held any discussion with the State Governments in this regard;and
- (d) if so, the details and outcome thereof?

Answer

MINISTER OF THE STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI AJAY MAKEN)

(a) to (d): Recruitment in Central Para Military Forces is an ongoing process with the help of UPSC, SSC and force recruitment boards. 60% of vacancies of Central Para Military Forces in constable (GD) rank are distributed amongst the States and UTs on the basis of population ratio. 20% of vacancies in the Border guarding forces (BSF, ITBP, SSB, Assam Rifles) are allotted to the border districts falling within their area of responsibility; the remaining 20% of vacancies in the border guarding forces and 40% in other CPMFs are allotted to the militancy and naxal affected districts as notified by the Government. Recruitment Centres for Constables exist in various States to ensure that no part of the country is neglected and-regular recruitment takes place so that maximum number of vacancies are filled up.
