STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a), (b), (c) & (d) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 244 REGARDING "ILL-EFFECTS OF MOBILE PHONE TOWERS ON BIRDS" BY SHRI M. ANANDAN, DUE FOR REPLY ON 11-08-2010.

- (a) &(b) As per the information available with the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Salim Ali Center for Ornithology and Natural History Society, Coimbatore, Centre for Environment and Vocational Studies of Punjab University and the Kerala Environmental Researchers Association are conducting some studies on the impact of electromagnetic radiation on the birds. The preliminary findings indicate that electromagnetic radiations from the mobile towers have some negative effects on birds especially House sparrows and also on the insects including the bees. However, no long-term nation wide studies have so far been conducted, which could show conclusively the adverse impacts of mobile towers on birds and insects.
