- (a) whether India records the highest number of deaths due to various diseases;
- (b) if so, the details thereof alongwith the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether as per a study of the World Health Organisation (WHO), poverty is a major cause of diseases;
- (d) if so, the details thereof;
- (e) whether WHO has given any suggestions to check deaths caused by poverty; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof?

Answer

(a) & (b): According to "Report on Causes of Death in India, 2001-2003" published by the Registrar General of India, non-Communicable diseases are the leading causes of deaths in the country constituting 42% of all deaths. Communicable, maternal, perinatal and nutritional conditions constitute another 38% of deaths. Injuries and ill-defined causes constitute 10% of deaths each.

Top 10 causes of deaths in India in all ages is given in table below:
