- (c) whether the DG of anti-dumping and allied duties has recommended provisional duty upto \$ 671 per kg. on import; and
- (d) if so, the reasons therefor and the extent to which it is likely to benefit the country?

Answer

- (a) & (b): In order to provide remedy to the domestic industry against dumped imports causing material injury, the Directorate General of Anti Dumping and Allied Duties (DGAD) has recommended imposition of anti-dumping duty in its final findings of anti-dumping investigations concerning imports of Sodium Nitrite, Potassium Permanganate, Sodium Hydrosulphite, Zinc Oxide, Hydrofluoric Acid, Caustic Soda, Potassium Carbonate, Titanium Dioxide, Melamine, Certain Rubber Chemicals, Polytetrafluoroethylene (PTFE), 1-Phenyl-3-Methyl -5-Pyrazolone, Sodium Formaldehyde Sulphoxylate, Pentaerythritol, Saccharin, Phosphoric Acid, Peroxosulphates, Maleic Anhydride, Sulphur Black, Hydrogen Peroxide, Diethyl Thio Phosphoryl Chloride, Carbon Black, Certain Phosphorous based chemical compounds and Coumarin from China PR.
