Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Government has formulated any policy for the development of National Highways;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether Government has any proposal to increase the width of National Highways in Karnataka; and;
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

Answer

MINISTER OF THE STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS (SHRI R.P.N.SINGH)

- (a) and (b) The development of National Highways (NH) and the works for the development of NHs are taken up based on the traffic density, inter-se priority and availability of funds. However, about 32,754 km length of NHs is programmed to be developed to 4 or more lane NH standards under various phases of the National Highways Development Project (NHDP). Also NHDP Phase-IV A includes development of about 5,000 km length of NHs. Other major programmes include development of about 3,513 km length of NHs under Phase A of the Special Accelerated Road Development Programme in the North East (SARDP-NE) including Arunachal Pradesh Package and 1,202 km length of NHs under Special Programme for development of roads in the Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected areas.
- (c) and (d) The details of the different types of widening works on the NHs taken up under various phases of National Highways Development Project (NHDP), Special Project for 2-laning etc. in the State of Karnataka are annexed.
